Thornborough Parish Council (TPC) Report

The most recent meetings of TPC took place on 18 February and 18 March. Flooding is again covered separately – please see the TFAG article on P 21.

The Annual Parish Assembly (APA)

Cllrs Morgan and Taylor are busy making arrangements for the session about Flooding – please see the APA advert on P20 just before the TFAG report.

The Sports Pavilion

TPC has now approved the initial remedial work, comprising:

- Removal of moss and the replacement of the broken roof and ridge tiles
West Est Co Ltd, T/A Oxfield Park £800
- Replacement of guttering, fascias, soffits, barge boards, gutter, downpipes and cladding. Including the installation of eaves trays and fascia vents.
Towcester Double Glazing £2,287.39 (plus VAT).

Land North of Bletchley Road, Thornborough

This is not a matter where TPC has any jurisdiction. However, Cllr John Chilver, Horwood Ward, has referred the matter to Buckinghamshire Council. In addition to Planning Enforcement (**EN/26/00170/COU**), the Homeless and Highways Teams are also involved in investigating the alleged change of use of land to residential through siting of a caravan for residential purposes.

NEW BEGINNINGS BY REVEREND JACQUELINE DOVE



I have lived in over 30 homes and five countries in the course of my sixty years so I'm used to new beginnings. However, as I get older, and hopefully a little wiser, leaving behind what is familiar has gotten harder. Moving to Horsmonden I found it hard saying goodbye to people I had come to love and was glad for Lent's focus on sorrow and lament. Lent "invites us to wade cautiously through the unknown, unsure when the light will

At the beginning of March, Richard and I made our way into the unknown on a beautiful sunny spring day. We arrived to find daffodils waving at us from the front garden of the Rectory and a vase of Tulips in the kitchen. The house soon filled with flowers and other gifts accompanying the welcome cards. This warm welcome extended to my licensing with people from the various Village organisations in Horsmonden each standing up to welcome me. The smile on my face in the photo taken by ?? says it all.

After journeying through Lent with its honest appraisal of our essential need to be loved we celebrate Easter with its message of the power of renewal after loss, of hope after despair. Coinciding with spring, Easter reminds us of the new life that follows the winter season. It reminds us of the Christian hope that love is stronger than hate, goodness is stronger than evil and ultimately life is stronger than death.

The Parish Council reformed the Flood Action Group in 2025 and its members have been busy! Learn more about what they have been doing.



Thornborough Flood Action Group update by Lynn Morgan

Thornborough Flood Action Group (TFAG) continues to work with Bucks Council Flood Team and Riparian owners on flood mitigation in the village. Residents are supportive of our efforts despite delays by the IDB (Internal Drainage Board) in clearing silt and vegetation at Lower End. This is caused by the heavy machinery required being busy in Padbury and Steeple Claydon. We are assured that we are next on the list.

We are also waiting for the Highways Dept to undertake actions in the village when funding becomes available in their new financial year. This will include the unblocking of identified drains and other matters related to the roads.

In the meantime, a group of volunteers from the village have helped to clear the gullies on the Thornton Road and Back St to allow water to flow into ditches thus reducing the level of flooding at Lower End. This has meant that the road closure times are reduced. **We are looking for a willing volunteer with a digger to help us** find the old pipe that we believe may have collapsed under the old gate by the plastic drums. We believe that this pipe takes the water from the ditch and into Cowerde Drain across the corner of the field by Hatchett Leys Bridge. **Any volunteers to assist with this would be most welcome.**

You will have noticed that contractors have been brought in by TPC to clear the Sportsfield stream to allow the high levels of water to leave the village quickly. We have regained a lovely view of the stream. A site for summer picnics or watching wildlife? It is also a possible area for wildflowers as part of improving biodiversity in the village. **Ideas are very welcome please!**

The **Annual Parish Assembly** for residents is to be held at **7.30pm on Wednesday 8th April in the Village Hall**. Along with issues concerning residents and reports from Clubs and societies, the main focus will be helping us to cope with the continuing heavy rainfall that causes flooding in Thornborough. Come and bring your questions and we will try to answer them. We will have information and input on **Flood Resilience** (what to do before, during and after a flood) and information on **Nature Based Solutions** that might help Thornborough cope with the increasingly heavy rainfall. Come and find out about 'leaky dams', field corner bunds, buffer zones and flood plains.
