Thornborough Flood Action Group update

Integrating the work of TPC and TFLAG

To date, as you are aware, TFLAG has worked to reduce flooding in the village in several ways.

We are now beginning to work on the initial draft of a Community Emergency Plan and this has raised the fact that TFLAG and TPC need to work together to ensure continuity both of such a Plan and the existence of a TFLAG group. The last TFLAG group worked hard to achieve progress on flood defence for the village but was then disbanded. The current TFLAG Group has continued to move forward to support the village but is in danger of collapse owing to lack of support from residents.

TFLAG is currently working on an Emergency Plan for Thornborough that has been initiated by the need to plan for other critical events as well as flooding. Recent events such as prolonged, very high temperatures, flooding, prolonged lack of power / water, storm damage, earthquakes and terrorism across the world require us to plan for emergencies. The aim of such a plan is to help residents of Thornborough to support themselves when faced with an emergency within the village.

Should a critical emergency take place in the village, a Coordinator would be required to action the Emergency Plan. We need a role rather than a particular person to hold this position. If the current TFLAG is also disbanded owing to lack of support, this role would fall back to TPC. Possibly the Clerk or Chair of TPC could initiate the Emergency Plan being put into action?

Other TFLAG matters:

We are still awaiting news of the consultations with Natural Flood Solutions and result of the funding bid done on our behalf by Bucks Council. (due Aug/Sept) Meeting with new Bucks Highways Area Liaison Officer has ensured that all highway gullies have received their annual clean this month. As a result, blocked drainage in the High St has been identified for attention asap.

Checks to ensure that Riparian owners have implemented their responsibilities to keep banks and streams clear of debris and excess vegetation will start this month.

We have volunteers to join us for a work group to clear the stream bed in front of the village hall, but please let us know if you would like to help.

Thornborough & Thornton Village Hall Annual Review and Chairman's Report June 2026



Prime Objective:

The village hall management committee have met their prime objective of keeping Thornborough & Thornton Village Hall open for use by villagers and village organisations.

Income:

Our normal income to the year ending March 2026 was £13,936 from 2 main sources; lettings (£9,844) and the 59 Club (£3,090). There are still a few spaces in the 59 Club still available – please contact a member of the committee if you wish to support us in this way.

We are very grateful for the continued support from the TPC and their annual £1,000 grant.

The Hall continues to be well utilised by a number of varied organisations along with the occasional celebratory event. We continue to see an uplift in new customer enquiries resulting in an increase in usage, with total hours booked up by 8% on the same period last year.

Ongoing Maintenance:

We have recently received a very generous anonymous donation which enabled us to invest in a brand new AV system which is both an improvement in quality and also much simpler to use!

The hall interior was given a redecoration by Stephen Quainton which is consistent with our policy of ongoing maintenance to protect and improve the hall as a village amenity. In addition, we added a splashback to the kitchen area around the sink and in front of the serving hatch to offer some protection from stains and scuffs. We have also just replaced the old (leaking) water boiler with a more energy efficient model.

Support Team:

Nikki Standing and Sophie Roberson continue their sterling work in keeping the hall functioning and presentable, and the Committee thank them for their efforts and dedication.

Committee Members:

During the year we were sad to lose Ann Payne from the Committee but we are delighted to have welcomed two new members in Les Davis and Deborah Wilson, who join Lynn Morgan, Sophie, Nikki, David and Liz.

Finally, I would like to express my thanks to the other members of the Committee for all their help; to David Telford for his work as Honorary Treasurer, to Liz Julier for her role as Hon. Sec, and to the concerted efforts of Nikki and Sophie in keeping the hall ticking along nicely.

As some of you may have seen, hemlock has been identified in the Sports Field. TPC have put temporary signs at the entrances to the sports field, and TPC are seeking quotes to place permanent signs to ensure all residents and visitors are aware of this and to take care near this plant.

The Sir Harry Moore Sports Pavilion

TPC have been working hard to obtain quotes from local companies to complete the removal and replacement of the ridge tiles of the pavilion. At the TPC meeting in July, TPC resolved to accept the quote from a company who will begin this work in September to avoid disruption to cricket season.

The Annual Operational Schedule and Setting the TPC 2026/7 Budget

A meeting of the Finance Group is being scheduled to be held over the summer, to commence the budget build for the next financial year starting April 2027.

Thornborough Cricket Club Update



It seems perverse for cricketers to wish for rain, but that is certainly what we at Thornborough Cricket Club have been doing in recent weeks, as I write this, in the face of a bone-dry July. Anyone who has visited the Sir Harry Moore playing field of late will have seen how day after day of blazing sun has turned the outfield to straw and caused crazy-paving-style cracks to open up underfoot. It is enough to make one wonder what changes might have to be made to our national summer sport if temperatures continue to rise at their current rate. Opening fixtures in March anyone?

At close to the two-thirds point in the season, both men's Saturday teams were going reasonably well in their inaugural Cherwell Cricket League campaigns, both sitting around mid-table in their respective divisions. The cricket is competitive though, and injuries have started to take their toll. It is to be hoped that the two sides – which are increasingly feeling the benefit of Thornborough's thriving junior programmes – have the resources to push rivals all the way to the finish on September 5th.

The unbroken fine weather did enable our popular Allstars and Dynamos sessions to proceed more or less unhindered in 2026, bringing the welcome sight of dozens of local boys and girls engaged in cricket-related activities back to the playing field on Friday evenings. There have been some terrific performances in league matches by the various Thornborough junior teams too, which certainly bodes well for the future. So does the fact that the junior section continues to grow, with an astonishing 88 young cricketers on the club's books.

Women's cricket is thriving in the village too. As I write this, the inaugural Thornborough women's softball cricket day is imminent. The Roses will be tackling a double-header, a match against a combined Buckingham-Stony Stratford side followed right away by a clash with Stewkley. Cakes and a barbecue are promised, along with other refreshments. I'll let you know how it went in a future report – that is if rain doesn't stop play!

STOP PRESS!! Well, it did rain on women's double-header day, believe it or not - but not enough to spoil the fun!

Two competitive matches produced a win and a loss for the Roses and underlined that women's cricket has well and truly arrived at Thornborough.
