Thornborough Parish Council (TPC) Report

The first TPC meetings of 2026 took place on 21 January. Flooding is again covered separately – please see the TFAG article on Page 13.

2026/7 Budget and Precept

TPC has approved a budget of £37,134 and a precept of £35,170 for the financial year 2026/7. The precept provides a Band D estimate of £113.35 for 2026/7, an increase of 1.94% on the 2025/6 Band D cost (£111.19).

TPC is Hiring!

The current clerk is retiring on 31 May 2026. The recruitment process to appoint a successor is now under way – please see the recruitment advert on page 18.

The Sports Pavilion

The report prepared by Cllrs Taylor, Synnott and Bursell in response to the building condition survey to help prioritise the required work and propose a way forward has been approved. Quotes will now be sort for the immediate work.

TPC is keen to compile a directory of local contractors/trade people who can be called upon to help with the repair and/or maintenance of the parish assets for which it is responsible. Please contact the Clerk (see below) if you or anyone you know might be interested in joining the directory.

TPC is extremely grateful to the resident who recently replaced the rotted allotment gate post who has volunteered to help with other repairs and maintenance work. Again, please contact the Clerk if you could and would like to volunteer. The cost of materials and any other expenses are covered by TPC for any work undertaken in a voluntary capacity.

Farewell to Richard Dove

Richard has today stepped down from TPC in advance of the Dove family's forthcoming move. Richard, who has been a councillor since September 2022, will be much missed. His most notable contributions have been as Chair of the TPC Finance Group; as a member of both the Biodiversity and Pond Project Team, and the Thornborough Flood Action Group (TFAG). Equally important has been his willingness to undertake both periodic

tasks such as turning the pavilion and allotment water on and off and routine tasks such as the weekly pavilion inspections.

Thank you, Richard, for all you have done for the parish – we wish you well for your forthcoming adventure.

The process of finding a replacement councillor will start shortly. Please contact the Clerk in the first instance if you or anyone you know might be interested in becoming a councillor.

The next meeting of TPC is scheduled for Wednesday 18 February 2026. at 7pm, in Thornborough Village Hall. Reflections from the Rectory by Rev'd Jacqueline Dove

This is my last Reflection from the Rectory. I have found the first reflection I wrote in August 2020 where I reflected on how the impact of the lock down had highlighted the South African philosophy of *Ubuntu Abantu* which is often translated as '*I am because we are*'.

Looking back over our five years in Thornborough I can see the impact of *Ubuntu Abantu* on both Richard and myself because we are not the same people we were when we first arrived. Living here in this village has forever changed us. When I think of Thornborough lots of faces come to mind, faces of people that make me smile. I arrived as a 'newbie vicar' during COVID which none of my training had prepared me for. Yet people embraced me as their Vicar and this warm embrace helped me grow in confidence as slowly, I became the vicar I am today. There were also lots of disappointments, things I organised which were not well supported - the few regular church goers not having the capacity to organise traditional church and village events.

However, I reached out to the village with the help of the Church Wardens, Charlotte and Laura, and a number of new people joined the Parochial Church Council (PCC) which has made a huge difference. Hence the success of the annual Church Quiz, the Hymns and Pimm's service in summer, the first Christmas Tree Festival and the planned Pancake Races on Shrove Tuesday this year.

I am because we are. I am who I am because of: the commitment and support of the PCC; the enormous privilege of giving the faithful few Holy Communion, the heartfelt appreciation I have received for the Christenings, Weddings and Funerals I have had the enormous privilege of taking; people keeping the church alive by supporting the big 5; the support and love the Chapel have given me; the Thornborough Infant School coming to the church for WOW and their annual nativity; the regulars who support Porch Sales; the children who came to Messy Church and those who participated in key services; the churchyard volunteers; the Harvest Supper in the church; the reinvigorated bell ringing team; countless conversations; the people who opened their homes to me; being part of the David Copperfield production. And so much more. You will all be greatly missed.

Thornborough Flood Action Group update by Lynn Morgan

TFAG continue to work behind the scenes to help the Village prepare for future flooding.

We would like to thank all riparian owners who have managed to clear potential blockages and vegetation that might cause a major issue in the event of a flood. When water levels rise dramatically, branches, overhanging brambles and debris in the stream can cause major problems as happened in the flood in Sept/Oct 2024. This problem led to a backup of water flooding the centre of the village. Thornborough Parish Council have contractors coming to clear the banks of the Sports field stream on February 23rd.2026

Lower End bridges are still awaiting clearance of silt and vegetation from the Internal Drainage Board. Unfortunately the machine required is very busy in other villages too. Work has been programmed in for mid /late February.

Work in the village on blocked drains and recutting some of the grips alongside roads that take water into ditches is still planned for Spring 2026 by the Local Highways dept. We assume that they are busy dealing with pot holes at the moment!

We are preparing to move forward with discussing a Community Flood Action Plan with residents that considers preparing for a flood, actions to be taken during a flood and what is required after a flood. We will be seeking your thoughts and ideas to help the village cope with future flooding.
