Thornborough Flood Action Group update

Much has happened since the last T News was published 2 months ago!

Summary of recent activities

- Buckinghamshire Council and The Freshwater Habitats Trust (NFM consultants) are now working with local Landowners to establish strategies for Natural Flood Solutions to slow water into the village.
- The local Internal Drainage Board have cleared the silt and debris from around Lower End bridges.
- The Annual Parish meeting in April focussed on flood management and Community Resilience.
- The new Lead Inspector from Buckinghamshire Highways has walked the village with representatives from TPC and TFLAG and flooding issues were highlighted to assist her in her role.
- Bucks Resilience Team members were present at the May Fayre / Sportsday to chat about Individual Resilience measures to interested residents

The future of TFLAG (Thornborough Flood Action Group)

TFLAG has had a successful 18 months and achieved its original aims with the assistance of Bucks Flood Management Team, Highways Dept, Resilience Team, the Local Internal Drainage Board (IDB) and Riparian owners in the village. We are very appreciative of the support provided to date.

We now need to work closely with village residents to establish both individual and Community Resilience and emergency responses in the event of a disaster whether it be flood, fire or some other event.

TFLAG will meet four times a year and in between meetings communicate by email. The group will continue to monitor the work of key organisations and individuals that support the village in keeping the water flowing and reducing flooding.

There is a need, on occasion, to create work parties to deal with issues that arise. A list of volunteers will be established who could be called upon, when needed to help with tasks. **Eg. walking the village streams, monitoring drains, reporting stream blockages, establishing Resilience measures etc.**
Volunteers for such 'action groups' would be greatly appreciated.

Please let us know if you would like to assist in any way, even on a one-off occasion.

St Mary's Church News, Services and Events

News

The Church of St Mary the Virgin, Thornborough has moved into a new era. We have said farewell to Jacqueline Dove and are now actively working with the church authorities on the process to appoint a successor.

In such circumstances it is left to the Churchwardens and Parochial Church Council (PCC) to run the church. This includes arranging our regular services as well as weddings, baptisms, burials, looking after the churchyard and preserving the fabric of the sacred building, part of which dates back to Anglo Saxon times.

The Church is an integral part of Thornborough village. As well as being a place of worship it is a building of beauty and history where other events can be celebrated and past lives remembered.

The PCC is working hard to keep the church going and are currently maintaining our established services. While we are without a priest, we still need to cover repair, maintenance, electricity, insurance, churchyard and ministry costs. This leaves us with a challenge, but a very worthwhile one.

A recent highlight was Easter Day which was a well-attended joint service with the chapel. **This regular joint service is held on the first Sunday of the month and alternates between the church and the chapel.** Our **traditional Holy Communion Service is held on the third Sunday of the month.** Details of all services are displayed on the church notice board. We are incredibly grateful to the retired clergy who have supported us, particularly Rupert Bursell and John King.

The bell-ringing group continues to meet in the bell tower every Monday at 7.30pm – please do come along if you would like to find out more.

The free book exchange, which is superbly managed by David Elliot, is at the back of the church – do pop in at any time, have a browse and take

any books that interest you. There is a great mixture of fiction, non-fiction, hobby books, children's books and more!

We are grateful to the volunteers who help maintain the churchyard. We endeavour to tend to the newer graveyard area on regular basis and adopt a lighter touch to the older areas to encourage biodiversity. As a result, we were pleased that in 2025 the churchyard was selected by Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes Environmental Records Centre as a Local Wildlife Site after its wildlife value was assessed against specific criteria by the Sites Selection Panel. Copies of their report and the species list are in the church.

St. Marys' Fundraising and Community Events

We were pleased to be able to take part in the Sports Day and May Fayre – thank you to organising committee and everyone who visited our stall.

Thank you too for those who continue to **support our porch sales**. It has been lovely to meet some new villagers (as well as villagers-to-be and passers-by) recently. The sales take place on the **second Saturday of the month**. Our ever-popular 'regulars' of fruit and cheese scones, sausage rolls and delicious traybakes and cakes are supplemented by seasonal eggs, jams, plants etc. As well as the produce there is always free tea and coffee and the opportunity for a chat with villagers. Please come down to our **next Porch sale on Saturday 13th June**.

We are also **planning to run a Community Café on 5th August** – to maintain the opportunity for villagers to get together while the school are on holiday.

Our fundraising and volunteer efforts all help maintain the church for our community. If you'd like to help in any way we'd love to hear from you!
