Reflections from the Rectory by Rev'd Jacqueline Dove

It's that time of the year when the parish churches hold their annual general meetings for 2023 and I write my annual report as Rector of the Blackthorn Benefice for the whole benefice. This year I wrote that one of my highlights across the benefice was, "The Thornborough Churchyard community clean up with the support of National Trust volunteers."

Thank God for community spirit. Remember the importance of community spirit during COVID. COVID turned all our lives upside down, reminding us of our vulnerability. Having our lives suddenly turned upside down by the end of a relationship, a bereavement, ill health, loss of a job - to name a few, is a common human experience. Those times when one minute we feel like we might shatter into a thousand pieces while simultaneously experiencing just how deep our physical, emotional and spiritual reserves can be. Those times when we learn to really appreciate the kindness of others, especially close family and friends, neighbours, doctors and nurses, and to experience how unkind and debilitating officious behaviour can be. In other words, those times we are reminded of the importance of love.

The daily reflection from the *Centre for Action and Contemplation* this morning was titled, 'Love is stronger than Hope'. It suggested that our great mistake is that we tie hope to outcome. So, if we can see a likely path to our desired outcome, we have hope; if we can see no possible path to our desired outcome, we have despair. However, when our prime motive is love, a different logic comes into play. We find courage and confidence, not in the likelihood of a good outcome, but in our commitment to love. To put it differently, even if we lose hope for a good outcome, we need not lose hope of being good people, as we are able: courageous, wise, kind, loving, "in defiance of all that is bad around us."

I think this is the primary vision of the Church. We are a community that desires with the help of God to "live as beautifully, bravely, and kindly as we can as long as we can, no matter how ugly, scary, and mean the world becomes, even if failure and death seem inevitable." Father Richard Rohr describes this kind of hope as "the fruit of a learned capacity to suffer wisely and generously. You come out much *larger* and that *largeness* becomes your hope." Or as the Apostle Paul said, "Let us not grow weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest, if we do not give up".

Frogspawn

The recent change in the weather has been welcomed by the children and adults alike. We are all at our happiest when we can take advantage of our beautiful village. Just this morning our younger children enjoyed a visit from some tadpoles, scooped from the stream. They explored the life cycle of frog, cut out and created their own friendly, green amphibians and wrote some fabulous sentences, before returning our visitors back to the stream and marvelling at the other wildlife within.





Zoolab

Thanks to funds raised at the Community Cafe, Zoolab returned and the children were, once again, enthralled. Not only did they enjoy the experience (important in its own right) but the repetitious nature of the visit was designed to support the children's recall of previously taught content through the power of 'Retrieval Practice'. Stick with me, some of this education stuff is interesting! Retrieval practice is the strategy of recalling facts, concepts, or events from memory to enhance learning. The act of retrieving something from your memory strengthens the connections holding it there, making it more likely that you will be able to recall it in the future. Sometimes called the "testing effect," retrieval practice in teaching is not limited to quizzes or exams but can include any exercise where children attempt to retrieve what they have learned from their memory. Evidence shows that retrieval practice is especially effective at increasing longer-term retention and outperforms more common strategies. Research in classrooms demonstrates that retrieval practice is an extremely robust strategy across age groups and subject domains and that it also aids in higher-order thinking; it is not just for memorisation. Those who use retrieval practice perform better on complex tasks and show improved metacognition. The bonus of the Zoolab activity was that having activated prior learning, the new content can be added, and children have a 'hook' into those memories. So, while the children think they are having fun, we are filling their minds with knowledge about our world!








Speech Cup

Thornborough Parish Council (TPC) Report

Cllr Mary Taylor was unanimously re-elected as chair at the Annual Meeting of TPC on 15 May 2024. This report is relatively short because the annual meetings for local councils include a fair amount of governance related business which doesn't make for exciting reading. The minutes provide the record of the business. The draft minutes are normally published on the TPC noticeboard and website (see link below) a week after the meeting and formally approved by TPC at the next meeting.

2023/4 Audit

TPC has again received a clean bill of health from the internal auditor. The audit document was approved for submission for external audit. The annual public rights period will be from 3 June – 12 July 2024 - the notice which explains this is an opportunity for residents to inspect the financial records will be published on the TPC noticeboard and website during the public rights period.

Environment and Facilities

This is a standing agenda item which frequently needs fairly lengthy discussion at TPC meetings and covers a lot of the work undertaken by the councillors between meetings. In addition to the various plumbing repairs recently undertaken, TPC has now approved the repair of the Sports Field and Pavilion showers at a cost of £1,280. An area of discussion at recent TPC meeting was the imminent closure of the Village Hall for renovation. TPC is pleased the Exercise Classes, and the Pilates and Yoga Classes will be using the Sports Field and Pavilion as an alternative during the closure because we are keen to extend the use of one of the parish's key assets. TPC has moved the Annual Parish Assembly, which is normally held in the Village Hall to the Methodist Chapel.

Future Meetings – change of venue

Due to the Village Hall refurbishment, the TPC meetings on 19 June 2024 & 17 July at 7pm will held at the Sir Harry Moore Sports Pavilion and possibly the September meeting on the $18^{\rm th}$. There is no meeting in August.
