# The recent Floodings

Following the extent and speed of the recent floodings, particularly those in Bridge St and opposite the Village Hall, TNews Editor thought it would be useful to share our fellow resident (and Councillor!) Mary Taylor's suggested actions set out in Thornborough eNews:

"As a village we ought to inform Buckinghamshire Council of the damage done here by the storms.

In the pub last night I was told about blocked pipes in the roads making matters worse and flooded houses. As I walked around yesterday I saw drain lids raised up and spewing water. I could smell raw sewerage. <u>We need to get this information together so that we can ask for support before next time.</u>

The first strategy is to use the FixMyStreet website: <a href="https://fixmystreet.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/">https://fixmystreet.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/</a>

<u>If everyone does that</u>, the message should get through that we have serious concerns about drainage on our roads here in Thornborough.

The second sensible thing seems to be to make a record of what happened. *I am happy to collate this if people will let me know details of damage*. I think it is worth recording near misses too, so that we can try to get a picture of how the village flooded and the time frame too. The pond is reported to have drained quickly after about 3am. We need to ask the question as to why that happened and could that have happened earlier.

I am doing this as a resident and not with my Parish Council hat so please use my private email mtaylor230@btinternet.com.

I am simply volunteering to try to collate information and would welcome help with this.

# Thornborough Village Hall Autumn 2024

When Liz and I moved to Thornborough 34

years ago, the village was debating what to do with the village hall – renovate or build a new one. Following the decision to renovate, we were captivated by the village's ability and creativity to raise the required funds.

When, on Sept 20<sup>th</sup> 2022, 2 years ago we held a meeting in the Church and asked the village to support us in raising funds to rescue the hall, we were optimistic that we could garner the support we needed. The hall was damp, cold, and unloved. The energy crises were driving up the cost of the heating and it was quickly becoming prohibitive and depleting our cash reserves.

We anticipated we needed c.£100k, but never imagined we would end up investing in excess of £140k in our village hall.



This has been achieved with the unbelievable help and support of the Thornborough & Thornton Fundraisers who, through their relentless campaign to raise funds have contributed a staggering £29k.

It doesn't end here. The Village Hall Management Committee is a registered Charity and we rely on your ongoing support to enable us to maintain and improve the hall. You can do this by using it, joining the 59 clubs, or simply making donations via Just Giving.

There are a huge number of people to thank and I wanted to use this opportunity for a few significant mention; Sue Kenyon our incredible project manager who worked so hard to make this happen, Liz Julier an irresistible force, Steve Coppins for the successful grant application, John Kenyon for the 50+ hours spent on the hall floor plus so many other jobs, Steve Quainton for staining the windows & doors, Stuart Mitchell, Richard Dove & Sue K for sorting



the wifi mesh, Jill Bury and Tina Bright for making the curtains, Gaye Warren & Nathan Avery for answering last minute eNews call to help, Ray and Dan Goodger for the AV support, Jacqueline Dove for the use of the Church for storage and displaced bookings, David and Bethan Telford and Vince Julier for window scraping, the Parish Council for their generous use of the Sports Pavilion for storage & manual labour to get everything there and the extremely generous & anonymous donation of new trolleys for the existing chairs and for everyone who turned up to help with the cleaning, moving items in & out and general support.

Finally, the Fundraisers who to date have raised over 29k and have been critical in achieving the village hall refurbishment and a specific thank you to Ann Payne who has recently stepped down after leading the charge on fundraising for many years and deserves a special mention – we could not reopen the hall without expressing our thanks and appreciation for all she has done and I hope our new hall stands as a fitting tribute to all her work and support.

Remember the COVID 'lock down' how suddenly communities realised the need for love-in-action. In times of crises like floods, fires and pandemics, communities are often very good at pulling together. The problem is we often get 'compassion fatigue' in the long run. I think 'compassion fatigue' is also 'discomfort fatigue', in that loving our neighbours often takes us out of our comfort zone especially if we are naturally more introverted.

Talking of putting love into action, I have a dream for a Blackthorn Chase Benefice free *Families and Children's club* called **WILD**. I love doing Collective Worship in both the Thornborough Infant School and Whaddon Church of England School and I think it would be wonderful if children from across the five villages (Beachampton, Nash, Thornborough, Thornton and Whaddon – and beyond) got together once a month to have fun and forge relationships. The long-term dream is to also start a Youth Hub.

**WILD (Wow, Imagine, Love, Discover)** will take place in the Nash Village Hall, Nash Recreation Ground, Nash Church and Church Yard (because Nash is in the middle) on the **2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of every month from 4-5.30pm, ending with an optional meal**. So that you can get your children home ready for bath and bed.

So why did I start with talking about love-in-action? Well, the focus of WILD, which will include stories, games, creative activities, and times of reflection is to teach children values such as gratitude, generosity, kindness, courage... In other words, those values that help us to let our light shine, as we learn to love others as well as loving ourselves. 



# Thornborough Cricket Club Update by David Owen



We have had so much rain lately that the 2024 cricket season already seems like a distant memory! Happily, the cricketing summer ended on a positive note for all Thornborough CC teams.

The inaugural Youth Cricket Festival was a great success, with teams from Buckingham, Stony Stratford, Westcroft and TCC playing a series of highly competitive matches over the August Bank Holiday weekend. I am pleased to report that TCC's fast-improving XI fought their way through to the final, where they went down to Westcroft's more experienced line-up with heads held high. Thanks to all mums and dads who supported the Club in this exciting new venture. **Plans are already being laid for a second – no doubt bigger and better - Festival to be staged at the same time in 2025.** 

The adult teams also finished their respective seasons on a high. The A team's consistency over four months was rewarded with promotion from Division 3 of the South Northants Cricket League. The race for the title went down to the wire, with Dan Harrison's men finishing just five points behind champions Woodford Halse A. The TCC first team also achieved their aim in securing their status for another season in the SNCL Premier Division in 2025. With the last home match a washout, everything hinged on the visit to local rivals Maids Moreton on the season's final Saturday. A tense encounter ended with TCC victorious by three wickets – enough to leapfrog Castlethorpe to safety.

#### As we go to press, the final touches are being made to <u>end-of-season award</u> presentation events for juniors and adults, with both scheduled to take place in the village on October 12th.

There may be no cricket, but the autumn and winter months are when much of the hard work is done at the Sir Harry Moore Playing Field. As you may have noticed, the square – which endured particularly heavy usage in 2024 – is in the process of being "Koro'd". It is expected that the new surface will perform better and stand up to the inevitable wear and tear in seasons to come. Paperwork needed to pave the way for installation of an artificial wicket, that should greatly facilitate further development of junior cricket at Thornborough, is also moving ahead.

# Thornborough Parish Council (TPC) Report

The most recent TPC meeting was on 18 September 2024. This report provides information about the areas of business which are most likely to be of interest to the community. The minutes provide the formal record of the meeting, they are published on the TPC noticeboard outside the Village Hall and our website: https://www.thornboroughparish.org.uk/Agendas\_and\_Minutes\_36577.aspx

#### The 2024 Village Maintenance Priorities

The identified village maintenance priorities for this year have been completed. As many residents will already know, both village pumps have been renovated. In addition to repainting, the posts and rails have been replaced. The bench on the village green in front of the school has also been renovated and the TPC noticeboard has been smartened up. One of the many challenges for small rural local councils is the cost of maintaining parish assets. TPC undertakes an annual survey as part of the budget setting process which in turn determines its precept requirement. Please do get in touch if you have any suggestions for maintenance priorities in 2025. Needless to say TPC will not necessarily be able to implement all suggestions, not least because it also needs to be able to deal with the unanticipated. This year it was the birds attacking the playground gazebo. This was particularly unfortunate not least because only last year the gazebo was comprehensively repaired.

It is worth mentioning the decision to allocate funding for the work required to the cherry trees on the green in front of the school. The contractor may well have completed this work before you read the newsletter.

#### Thornborough Cricket Club (TCC)

TPC is committed to working with TCC to support the artificial wicket grant application it is preparing. The requirements of funding bodies tend to be complex for community groups and small local councils. TPC is currently finalising a 5-year season hire agreement to support TCC's grant application.

At the recent meeting TPC also considered at some length TCC's wish to erect a netted post and rail fence along the Sports Field Back Street boundary. On balance the councillors felt some of implications of the proposal required further exploration in advance of a decision.

#### **Pond and Diversity Project**

Cllr Dove and Morgan attended the recent Biodiversity Conference arranged by the Buckinghamshire and Milton Keys Association of Local Councils in partnership with the Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire Wildlife Trust. A day well spent - the conference was interesting and informative. Cllrs Dove and Morgan will now plan how best to take forward relevant information with the villagers who expressed interest at the Annual Parish Assembly.

#### **External Auditors Report and Certificate**

The report has been now been received for the financial year 2023/4. It confirms TPC's governance and accounting arrangements are satisfactory – in case you are wondering this is highest accolade that can be achieved!
