# Thornborough & Thornton Village Hall Annual Review and Chairman's Report June 2025



## **Prime Objective:**

The village hall management committee have met their prime objective of keeping Thornborough & Thornton Village Hall open for use by villagers and village organisations.

## **Income:**

Our normal income to the year ending March 2025 was £11,432 from 2 main sources; lettings (£8,745) and the 59 Club (£2,685). There are still a few spaces in the 59 Club still available – please contact a member of the committee if you wish to support us in this way.

Following the reopening of the Hall, the reception has been very positive and we are experiencing an upturn in new enquiries and regular/repeating bookings.

We are very grateful for the continued support from the TPC and their annual £1,000 grant.

## **Refurbishment:**

The Hall reopened for general use on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> September 2024, to a wonderful reception and the Committee are delighted to hear that the village is again proud of the facility and highly appreciative of the work the committee and other contributors have undertaken to complete the refurbishment project. Your comments are always well received.

There are still a few additional enhancements we have in mind, and subject to funding, these should be completed this year. We recognise that maintaining the hall is very much an ongoing commitment, and we have put in place a maintenance/monitoring schedule to aid us in achieving this.

## **Support Team:**

In January of this year, Nikki Standing agreed to take on the role of Hall Manager and following a short induction to the systems and processes, has taken the reins with enthusiasm and seamless efficiency! Her role includes monitoring the booking requests, processing deposits, and post-booking checks to ensure the hall is left in a fit state. Between Nikki's

efforts and those of our indefatigable cleaner, Sophie Roberson, the hall is kept in pristine condition.

### **Committee Members:**

We have recently 'lost' a few of our committee members following the conclusion of the Fundraisers campaign to support the hall, and in addition our long-standing member, Bernard Garbe has sadly moved away. I would like to thank them all for their contributions, good humour and time in helping us achieve our objectives. A special thank you to Bernard for his many years in office on the Committee.

***We are now eagerly looking for new members to support and join the committee.*** It is not an onerous commitment but an important one for the village to help keep the Hall available as a crucial amenity for the varied clubs, societies and classes, as well as those key family gatherings and events! Please contact **Liz Julier or me by email or phone** if you would like to help. Just as the hall needs a refresh every so often, so does the committee!

Finally, I would like to express my thanks to the Committee for all their help and support, to David Telford for his work as Honorary Treasurer, to Liz Julier for her role as Hon. Sec, and to the concerted efforts of Nikki and Sophie in keeping the hall ticking along nicely.

## Thornborough Parish Council (TPC) Report

TPC has met twice in June and July since the previous edition of the newsletter. Flooding currently continues to be the primary priority and is covered separately – please see the article **on page 16**. There is no TPC meeting in August.

The next TPC meeting is on **17 September 2025 in the Village Hall at 7pm**. The agenda will be published a week before the meeting on the TPC noticeboard outside Thornborough Village Hall and the TPC website: <https://www.thornborough-pc.gov.uk/>.

The meetings are open to the public who can speak during the ‘Public Participation’ session.

### Planning Application Consultation 25/02132/APP

Land to the South and North of Nash Road and Land to the East of Thornton Road Thornton Buckinghamshire.

Installation of a solar farm comprising ground mounted solar PV panels with an installed capacity of 49.99MW AC including mounting system, inverters, underground cabling, stock proof fence, CCTV, internal tracks and associated infrastructure, landscaping, biodiversity net gain and environmental enhancements for a temporary period of 50 years and a permanent substation. [Source: Buckinghamshire Council Aylesbury Area Planning Team]

The recent arrival of this planning consultation for an extensive solar farm on Thornton Estate land was completely unexpected. The proposal impacts on Thornton, Thornborough, and Nash to differing degrees. TPC has been granted an extension until after its September meeting.

## Reflection from the Rectory by Rev'd Jacqueline Dove

It's said that human beings can survive about five weeks without food, and about five days without water, but we can't survive five minutes without hope. Thinking of hope the first thing that comes to mind are these words of Emily Dickenson: "Hope" is the thing with feathers - That perches in the soul - And sings the tune without the words - And never stops - at all ... Hope is such a precious gift. I say gift because many faith traditions, particularly Christianity, view hope as a gift from God, a divine grace that provides comfort and strength in the face of adversity. It is also a gift we can offer to others through acts of kindness and encouragement. If we think of hope as a gift then it is something we need to be willing to open our hearts and minds to give and receive. In many ways hope goes hand in hand with trust, trusting in the goodness of God and/or the goodness of each other.

However, I think there is a lot to despair about at the moment. What is happening in Gaza is appalling and there are other equally appalling things happening that are not making it into the news. I do often weep hearing the news and my soul is frequently downcast within me. What we need is a way to be honest about what's broken while still leaving the door cracked open for hope, which for me goes hand in hand with opening my heart to God's transfiguring love. *Kate Bowler writes: "Dum spiro, spera"*. Latin for, 'While I breathe, I hope'. Hope not as a formula or an assurance that things will get better, but the refusal to relinquish imagining a better world. The caregivers and healthcare workers who offer presence when they cannot offer a cure. The artists who create out of ruin. The neighbours who show up anyway. The person, feeling terrible lately, for whom getting out of bed and taking a shower is an act of hope. Let's celebrate them."

*May the God of hope fill you with all Joy and Peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope. Romans 15.13*

Work has been continuing in the woods in clearing the trees with Ash Die-Back and thinning out the pines near the pond. The long grass has been cut and baled in all the woods; and the paths which had large holes in them from the hedge trimming have been filled in.

The machinery we use to maintain the woodlands have taken a battering this year, with a new clutch needed for the tractor and puncture prevention fluid added to all the tyres and new decks for the mowers. # THORNBOROUGH FLOOD ACTION GROUP 2025

**We need your help before flooding returns to Thornborough!**

**Thornborough Parish Council** would like to reestablish **Thornborough Flood Action Group. TFAG** will be looking at the actions required to help reduce the flooding in the Parish.

The problem is that we have more water coming into the village caused by heavy rainfall than can be absorbed or drained away quickly enough resulting in widespread flooding. We have had 3 major floods in the last 5 years.

***We need your thoughts and ideas particularly from landowners and those that suffer from flooded homes or those of you who have already made changes to your property to help alleviate flooding.***

## **WHAT YOU CAN DO TO HELP NOW**

**Flooding is not going to go away. Our changing climate means that it will get worse unless we take action as a community.**

- *We need photographic/video evidence of recent floods, particularly in October 2024 or January 2025 to assist in applying for funding to help solve some of the issues. **Please send pictures or videos to [lynn.morgan@thornboroughparish.org.uk](mailto:lynn.morgan@thornboroughparish.org.uk)***
- *Please let us know details of any internal flooding to your property during the last 5 years if you have not already done so. Again, contact [lynn.morgan@thornboroughparish.org.uk](mailto:lynn.morgan@thornboroughparish.org.uk)*

Three councillors from Thornborough Parish Council will form the core of the Flood Action Group. We are looking for other residents in the Parish to join us, particularly anyone experienced in Natural Flood Management or protecting homes susceptible to flooding. We have the full support of Bucks Flood Management Team and will be provided with ideas for funding for flood protection.

### **Some of the problems:**

- We have two village streams that take the bulk of the water. Both have limited flood plains to absorb and slow down the flow of water from local agricultural land on both sides of the village.
- Both roads coming down from the A421 become rivers during times of flooding.
- At key points in the village we appear to have backflow from overloaded sewers.
- The area around and under Lower End Bridge is blocked with silt and has limited depth to take the volume of water.

### **Actions required:**

- Riparian owners within the village have already been asked to keep the areas for which they are responsible clear of debris to allow the increased water flow.
- A full clearance of the stream bed around and under Lower End Bridge.
- Identify Natural Flood management (NFM) strategies with the help of Bucks Flood Management Team to slow down the flow of water into the village.
- Advice on flood protection solutions for properties at risk of flooding.

- ***We need to walk the streambeds before they fill with water again to check for any blockages. This will be done during the **week commencing 14<sup>th</sup> August 2025**. We may be passing through the stream in your garden. You may wish to join us and show us any issues causing concern.***
- ***We will be pushing Bucks Council to do a full clearance of the silt at Lower End Bridge. We have our Ward Councillor, John Chilver assisting us with this matter.***
