Thornborough Parish Council (TPC) Report

The most recent meeting of TPC was on 15 January 2025. This report provides information about the areas of TPC activities that are most likely to be of interest to the community. The minutes provide the formal record of the meeting, they are published on the TPC noticeboard outside the Village Hall and the TPC website. The next TPC meeting is on 19 February at 7pm in the Village Hall.

Update on Flooding and Riparian Ownership: January 2025

TPC is pleased to report a very positive response to our visits to various properties to discuss riparian responsibilities with residents. To date we have been concentrating on properties with riparian rights that are situated where the floodwater may get held up as it leaves the village i.e. Between the pond and Lower End bridge.

For those of you who are not aware, normally a landowner owns a stretch of water that runs on or alongside their land. If it constitutes a boundary of their land, the landowner will normally own up to the centre of the watercourse, with the adjacent landowner owning from the centre towards their land.

Riparian rights arise naturally by virtue of a landowner owning land abutting on to the bank of a watercourse. This explains why it is likely nothing will be recorded in title deeds about them.

Riparian owners' responsibilities:

- Reporting incidents including flooding, blockages, pollution and any unusual changes in the flow of water.
- Letting water flow through their land without any obstruction, pollution or diversion which affects the rights of others. This may involve removing fallen trees or overhanging branches that may affect the flow of water.

We hope that attention to potential stream blockages over the few weeks will prevent some of problems caused to the flow of water from the village during recent flooding events.

TPC councillors will be checking the watercourses through the village in their waders when water levels fall. Any offers of help would be much appreciated!

TPC is also consulting Buckinghamshire Council about the problems at Hatchett Leys / Lower End bridge where the water does not appear to be leaving the village at the rate required to prevent flooding.

Village Pond and Biodiversity Project Update: January 2025

The Village Pond Environmental Survey report (kindly funded by **Buckingham & Local Villages Community Board** and carried out by a 'Future Nature' consultant from BBOWT) was received in February 2024.

To date, owing to lack of time (TPC is somewhat lacking in numbers of Councillors), we have moved very slowly with our future plans for the Pond and improving Biodiversity in the Parish.

We are pleased report that the mowing schedules around the Pond and stream outside the village hall have been adjusted to allow for improving the habitat for wildlife whilst also improving the views of the Pond. Our work party cleared some of the branches to allow for a better view of the Pond from the bridge by the village hall. We arranged for the rubbish bin to be moved away from the bench by the Pond to make the area a better place to relax and hope to plant wildflowers in the area behind the bench this year.

We have received funding from our hard-working **Thornborough and Thornton Fundraisers** for a Community Information Notice board by the Pond (parallel to the path and to the left of the suffragette figure). This board will be dedicated on one half to Pond and Biodiversity information and the other half will be for general Community information. This board is a direct response to answers to the questionnaire that parishioners completed and discussed at the 2024 Annual Parish Assembly. We will also be adding some smaller boards around the Pond area to provide further information on issues such as feeding the ducks, plant / bird life, etc.

We hope to form interest groups to assist us with tasks such as bird identification and monitoring, plant life surveys, water sampling, improving habitats around the Pond and improving Biodiversity in the Parish generally.

Please offer your assistance if you would like to help in any way. All offers gratefully received!

The budget for the financial year 1 April 2025 – 31 March 2026 has now been set at £30,455 to enable TPC to fulfil its statutory responsibilities as the first tier of local government. A significant amount of the budget is used to maintain the parish assets. TPC has increased the precept for 2025/6 to £34,500. The current financial year has been costly which means TPC may have to offset some of its annual expenditure against the periodic expenditure budget allocations. The increased precept is required to enable TPC to continue to build its reserve to comply with the sector recommendation for small parishes. The 12% increase is an additional £11.99pa or 23 pence per week for a band D property in 2025/6.



Reflections from the Rectory by Rev'd Jacqueline Dove

I'm writing this the day before 'blue Monday' which is apparently the most depressing day of the year, probably aided and abetted by the bleak winter weather.

I find it helpful to live my limited, frail, fraught, earthly life as part of a much bigger story, namely God's story! I find comfort knowing that my story shares a lot in common with many other stories whilst also being completely unique, like the unique pattern of my finger print. Aah the beautiful, mystery of life!

The Church Year helps me walk through the larger-than-just-my-life sacred story that through faith I have chosen to be a part of. The Church of England's calendar is divided into liturgical seasons, grouped around important Christian festivals and currently we are in the Season of Epiphany when we remember the visit of the Magi to see Jesus. So, we're still celebrating Christmas in our home which is handy as we were sick over Christmas.

Our next project will look at social care support

We want to hear from people who have looked for support or care for themselves or another adult who lives in Bucks.

Many of us will need extra support at some point

We may need more help if we have a disability or a condition which means we struggle to do everyday tasks. Without help our wellbeing and independence may be affected. This is where social care can step in.

Have you already looked for help or would you know where to look for help?

We want to know where you looked for help and how easy was it to find. What made the process easy and what could be improved? Did you receive the care you were looking for and what impact has this made on your life?

Project manager Alison Holloway says:

Social care is something people often don't think about until they are in a crisis situation and need it urgently. It is therefore so important that people can be well informed quickly and that the process to get the help required is clear and straightforward. With this project, we want to look at where there might be issues with the process to obtain appropriate support, then make recommendations that will help to tackle them.
