Reflections from the Rectory by Rev'd Jacqueline Dove

I have no idea what 2022 has in store but if it's anything like 2021 it will no doubt have plenty of really challenging times. I am increasingly aware how my well-being is intrinsically linked not only to the well-being of my nearest and dearest, but also the well-being of my village, my Church community, my countries (Britain and South Africa), the other nations of the world and indeed the very planet itself.

We live in an era which elevates the individual above all else. We are encouraged to celebrate our own unique stories, our own personal truth. There is a lot that is positive about this. If we are to love our neighbour as we love ourselves, we need to know and love ourselves.

But we can also so easily become self-absorbed to the point of being consumed by our own story in isolation from each other's stories. The world can feel very noisy, with everyone wanting to be heard, and very few people willing to listen, truly listen. It seems sometimes as if it is the loudest, most self-centred and potentially most destructive individuals who end up being the 'King of the Castle'.

Likewise, it feels, at times, as if it is the loudest and most self-absorbed of my own emotions which rule the roost, overriding my good intentions and causing me to slide all the way down a long snake in an emotional game of 'snakes and ladders'. I'm the first to admit I need help from God if I am to come anywhere close to being the person God created me to be. The person my family and friends, my Church and country and the planet need me to be. This is why I start and end each day spending time in prayer and meditation.

Thomas Keating (1923–2018), the founder of the practice of Centering Prayer, explained how meditation is linked to the healing of our shortcomings. He called it the divine therapy: 'The only prayer you need to say is, "Help!" It's right to the point. It describes what we need. And when it comes from a heart that is broken by its own failures, it moves God to the very roots of the divine nature and God responds.' (Thomas Keating with Tom S., Divine Therapy and Addiction: Centering Prayer and the Twelve Steps (Lantern Books: 2009), 102, 105-106.)

So perhaps this is the best way to start 2022, not with yet another list of resolutions but rather with a cry from the heart as we acknowledge our personal, and collective, deep-seated need for God's transforming love. Happy New Year!

The Village Hall continues to be open and available for bookings, with rates starting at £8 per hour for village organisations, £10 per hour for residents and £12 for non-residents, and with access to both a projector and sound system, it is a great place for your next event. The Post Office is regularly open between 2pm to 5pm on Wednesday afternoons and continues to offer a full range of services.

As we head into 2022, we are reviewing priorities around the improvement of the Village Hall and have been discussing with the Parish Council. There are certain structural priorities around damp proofing and insulation which we are focussing on initially, and then looking at options around interior refurbishment, to ensure the Village Hall remains a welcoming place for the use of local groups and residents. Thornborough Parish Council (TPC) Report

Since the previous edition of Thornborough News was published TPC has met twice in November and January. The minutes of the TPC meetings provide the formal record of the business. The minutes are published on the TPC noticeboard and website. This report focuses on topics that are likely to be of greatest relevance to residents.

YAY! Celebrating the good news

TPC successfully applied for funding from the Buckingham and Villages Community Board (B&VCB) to install a new floor in the Sir Harry Moore Sports Field Pavilion. The work was undertaken in the first week of January and in advance of the new Preschool term.



Grant funding was also secured for the pond to be dredged. This activity is usually funded by TPC from its budget which in turn means it is paid for by the residents of Thornborough. However, the work undertaken by TPC with volunteers in the wake of the December 2020 flooding allowed a successful funding case to be made to B&VCB. The work was undertaken in November (see Front Cover) so as not to disturb the wildlife. The surrounding area got a bit churned up because the ground was wet. However, the first shoots of recovery grass are already bravely coming through.

Sometimes good news really does come in threes. The funding application submitted in October 2020 for parking on the verge outside the pavilion was also approved late last year. The work will be undertaken by Transport for Bucks which means TPC doesn't have any control over the timescale, so fingers crossed

we have to wait months rather than years. It will be worth the wait when it is done, particularly for the Preschool parents and children who will no longer have to deal with the challenges of the winter mud.

TPC is still waiting to hear if the funding application to replace our streetlights with energy efficient LED lanterns is successful. If this grant funding is secured it will reduce both Thornborough's streetlighting bill and carbon footprint. The cost of streetlighting energy was increased by 33% as of 1 December 2021.

In the coming year TPC also hopes to work with the Village Hall Committee so we can jointly apply for grant funding to undertake the much needed renovations to the Village Hall. This will be a significant amount of work so please do get in touch if you'd like to volunteer to help.

2022/3 budget and precept setting

The budget covers the responsibilities that fall under TPC's remit as a local council. The precept is the small proportion of residents' council tax bill which funds TPC's activities. The precept is based on the tax base which reflects the number of Band D equivalent properties in the parish. It changes year on year which reflects changes in those qualifying for council tax relief, house sales and new builds. An unchanged precept would have required an increase of 0.72%. Mindful of the challenging economic climate, TPC has kept the precept increase to a minimum:

Dog waste bins

TPC has been monitoring the dog waste bins near the sports field, in the centre of the villages and by the allotments to establish whether an additional bin is needed. The cost of purchasing a bin and the ongoing cost of the emptying service is quite substantial. As long as the dog waste bins aren't misused, TPC has concluded the cost of a fourth bin can't be justified at the present time. Under the contract TPC has with Buckinghamshire Council the dog waste bins should be emptied every Friday (twice a week in the summer).
